Four Congregations What is our Future?

In early March the president of the Bethel Lutheran Congregation in Ishpeming invited the presidents and vice-presidents of the four Ishpeming ELCA congregations along with their pastors to a meeting to think together about our future. It was a good discussion about our ministry and our work together in this area. All our four congregations have faced struggles over the last decade. All four churches have experienced membership and worship attendance number decline. The aging of our community has taken its toll over the last twenty years. Finances are a struggle and volunteers are always in short supply.

The four congregations began in the 19th century in three different ethnic communities and synods. Bethany Lutheran came from the Swedish Augustana Synod, Trinity Lutheran was organized by Norwegian immigrants, Bethel and Faith began as Suomi Synod Finnish congregations. Times have changed. The immigrant languages in worship ended about 80 years ago as English became the preferred language of worship. Thriving ministries with each congregation employing a full-time pastor or even two (in Bethel's case) have given way to much smaller worshiping communities.

Now we are faced with pastoral vacancies within three of our congregations. Still the work of God's people in the Ishpeming area continues. Faithful lay and clergy are asking what the future holds. Working with the synod, we are all asking what is next? What can God do to renew God's Church in this area, and what can we do to make the ministry vibrant.

We are asking Godly questions: How many congregations are best for the work of the kingdom here? How can our buildings be used to support this ministry? What are our pastoral needs? How can we attract more of God's people (especially young people) to serve with us? What positive actions have we done together already and how has that work enhanced our service to the community?

There are many more questions that need to be explored. As we think together over the next year(s) we know how important our congregations are to our people. We are all committed to listening to all the voices in our congregation and in the community. We are committed to work with the Synod and to learn from their experience. We are committed to think together and to be open to the Holy Spirit. We are committed to be responsive and responsible in our ideas and suggestions.

Our group of Ishpeming congregational leaders will continue to meet. There is much to think about and to pray about. God has blessed the Lutheran community in Ishpeming since 1870, when the first of our congregations (Bethany) began its ministry. We can depend on God to continue to encourage us and lift us up to do His will.

Please contact your congregational president or me for more information. Not only will we keep you informed, we will keep you in the conversation. What is God up to?

Equipping the Saints for Ministry

"We've Been Here Before"

While it's certainly true that we are dealing with new realities in society and church—realities that didn't exist a generation ago—there is value in recognizing that previous generations have dealt with similar challenges of changing times. Reading the book of Acts and the challenges and amazing fluidity of the early church, we can find strength and hope in truly understanding that God's people have been here before—both through the good and the bad. The players may have changed, but the basic patterns of life and humanity are amazingly similar.

I believe that there is value in reflecting on the past to gain perspective for our present reality. There is a dangerous pride in thinking our lives are totally unique and new and have no connection to the past. It is dangerous to believe that those who have gone before us have nothing to teach us.

While I'm certainly not a scholarly historian, I do enjoy reading about the past. I find that the past can challenge me, inform me, and ultimately give me perspective and hope. It's in this spirit of reflecting on the past, that I want to share some perspectives from past synod bishops of the Northern Great Lakes Synod. For this article, I'm sharing some perspectives from the first bishop of the Northern Great Lakes Synod, Harry Andersen (bishop 1987-1991). The ELCA and the Northern Great Lakes Synod officially began January 1, 1988.

In the December 30, 1988, edition of "Northern Lights Notes and Quotes", Bishop Andersen wrote the following: Let us learn from our mistakes. Yes, and let us avoid as many mistakes as possible. But if fear of mistakes immobilizes us, if uncharted courses dismay us, then I say, let's forge ahead. Run the risk of trying new approaches. Think new thoughts...Dare new faith journeys. Take what God gives us and call it opportunity. Count it treasure for the journey. As His faith pilgrims, travel light. Leave baggage behind. Say "yes and thousand times yes" to His call to His mission.

I suspect that those of you who knew this man, can see and hear him in your minds speaking these words. Bishop Andersen's words from 1988 are just as powerful and relevant today. I never had the privilege of meeting Bishop Andersen. Even only one year into the existence of the Northern Great Lakes Synod, Bishop Andersen quipped:

"We have the beginning of new traditions. Already I've heard someone say, 'That isn't the way we did it last year." Even more important than recognizing that "we've been here before," is proclaiming in faith, "God has been here before!" The ancient Hebrews would often build altars of stone to remember God's special action at a particular time in history. "To remember" God's faithfulness in the past is to be encouraged to trust God's faithfulness for the present moment and for the future. Those who have gone before me, like Bishop Andersen, remind me that it is on Christ the solid rock I stand. All other ground is sinking sand.



Council Meeting Highlights

- Laura Korte provided financial reports with typical monthly expenditures. The ad in the Church Section of *The Mining Journal* was discussed. A motion to delete the ad was duly made, seconded and approved.
- Pastor Tom will schedule a new member reception, the installation of congregational leaders and a baptism. Form A will be submitted this week after the number of members are corrected to a more accurate number. He also provided an updated list of guest pastors through June.
- Altar Guild has added JoAnn Manty, Sharon Eklund and Robert Lake to its service. A suggestion was made for Dede to hold a "training" session for people who may be interested in serving to find out what Altar Guild entails.
- Vic Cox patched the bolt holes in the ceiling and walls of the fellowship hall. Dede will prime those areas and will purchase ceiling paint. A painting palooza will be held in the coming months.
- The Superior Health Foundation has sent a message regarding the \$2500 AED grant completed by JoAnn Manty.

Council Highlights

- Brad Heinzman stated the basement kitchen mold cleanup was completed by SCI in February. Additional mold was found behind the cabinets which were removed and the area cleaned. A plan was discussed to add material to the driveway behind the church to stop any future water leakage in the basement during Spring thaw but this work will wait until the area is dry.
- Pastor Skrenes talked about the Holden Lenten Services being held at Bethany for Lenten season.
 All roles for the program have been filled. Kathy Koski advised Trinity and Faith are providing soup on Wednesday, March 6th and that we have enough volunteers to cover our obligation.
- Adele Price asked if we had enough people on our Call Committee. It was determined Beth Heinzman, Mary Johnson, Kathy Koski, Tim Kubas and Gary Price are currently members on this committee. If you are interested to serve, or your name was omitted by mistake, please contact the office or one of the members listed.
- Lori Syrjala advised Staff Support scheduled an interview for the Administrative Assistant/Finance Secretary position on March 5th. Council provided consent to allow the candidate to start immediate training if the job was offered and accepted. We are happy to introduce Sara Galvin as our new Administrative Assistant/Finance Secretary. She started training on March 7th. Welcome Sara!
- The Parochial Report A to the SYNOD will be completed and submitted no later than March 15th.
- Cory Beth Grigg discussed a combined Ishpeming ELCA Church meeting held on Sunday, March 4 for Council Presidents and Vice Presidents to discuss ways the four churches can combine efforts for community outreach. The next meeting is March 17 at Bethel.
- Time & Talent sheets received were used to comprise a list of congregation members willing to serve during worship and special events throughout the year. Rose Larson stated the Worship & Music Committee will assign servants for worship each week from the list provided.

- The Department of Health & Human Services (DHHS)
 contacted Trinity for permission to have evening Foster
 Care visitation with the families and a DHHS
 Supervisor. There was liability concern and coverage
 was confirmed. DHHS was notified that Trinity is
 available for supervised Foster Care visitation.
- Peter Johnson informed Council that our Memorial & Bequest Committee currently has five members but our Constitution requires seven. Cory Beth Grigg and Lori Syrjala were accepted as new members meeting the Constitution requirement. Rose Larson provided recommendations that M&B monies be provided to Good Gifts (purchase of livestock, necessities, etc. in depressed areas of the world); Ishpeming, Negaunee and Westwood High School Backpack Programs, and future Seminarians.
- Pastor Skrenes provided Pulpit Supply through June 9. Faith is hosting Maundy Thursday services on March 28 at 6:30 p.m. and a Good Friday Cantata will be at the Ishpeming Peterson Auditorium on March 29 at 6:30 p.m. Worship service times will switch effective May 5 with Trinity worship at 9 a.m. and Faith worship at 10:45 a.m.
- A Joint Trinity and Faith Council meeting is scheduled at Trinity on April 8th at 6:30 p.m. Trinity's Council meeting will immediately follow. The next Joint Council meeting will be held at Faith.
- Council installation will be held during worship on Sunday, March 24th (Palm Sunday). All Council members are asked to be in attendance.
